ANGELSHARK


Materials:

2 Paper plates1 large cereal boxStaplerColouring pens & pencilsScissors1 Split pin





1) Draw the head outline on base of 1st plate and cut out. Place this on top of the underside of your 2nd plate, draw around and then cut that out too.






- 3) Using the 1st large section of the cereal box, draw and cut out the **pectoral fins**.
- 4) Now secure the head to the Pectoral fins with a few staples.

You will need to put the base of the Stapler into the sharks mouth to reach the fins.

- 5) Using the 2nd large section of the box draw out the enlarged **pelvic fins** down to the tail and cut out.
- 6) Use one side of the box where there is already a fold, draw and cut out 2 dorsal fins (see photo page 2) the caudal fin (tail fin) and 2 sets of barbels (used to taste and search for food).








- 7) Construct the fins by folding them in half, cut a slit at the base of the fin up to the fold, this creates tabs. Use these to staple and attach to the main tail.
- 8) Cut a slit in the base of the tail and the **caudal fin**, slot together. Then glue the **barbels** to the front of the mouth.



9) Attach the **pectoral fins** and **pelvic fins** with the split pin and bend flat to give your Angel shark its swimming movement.



- 10) Fold a piece of white paper and roll it small, push into the back of the mouth. This will keep it open.
- 11) Time for some **camouflage**. Angel sharks are epic ambush predators so they need to blend into their surroundings. You could use a mixture of colouring pencils and pens to give different shades and patterns.



12) Finally give your Angelshark eyes on the top of its head and 2 **spiracles**. (openings just behind the eyes. They use these to pump water over their gills while lying motionless in the sand, waiting to ambush their next tasty meal. You could take yours outside, see if you can find some great hiding places.
